A short, interactive power point presentation to introduce climate change adaptation, past/current climate trends and future projections and begin the conversation about local adaptation.

#### Who is it for?

Any group that wants to better understand the impacts of climate change for their community and raise awareness of potential actions while collecting other local people's views and lived experiences of climate change.

### What will you have as a result?

Improved awareness of the difference between climate change mitigation and adaptation; basic knowledge of past/current climate trends and future projections; an overview of the key consequences of climate change for Scotland, and suggestions and discussion prompts for what local adaptation actions may look like.
