Scottish Climate Change Adaptation Programme (I)



The Climate Change (Scotland) Act requires a statutory climate change adaptation programme

First Scottish Climate Change Adaptation Programme published May 2014 – risk led approach

Aim: to increase the resilience of Scotland's people, environment and economy to the impacts of climate change

 Annual progress reports and two independent assessments by the CCC Adaptation Sub-Committee





Scottish Climate Change Adaptation Programme (I)



Climate Change (Scotland) Act includes Public Bodies Climate Change Duties:

- Requires that Public Bodies exercise their functions in a way best calculated to deliver the statutory adaptation programme;
- Report compliance annually.

Second Scottish Climate Change Adaptation Programme due 2019





Examples of local planning and action: Edinburgh Adapts



- City wide vision and action plan developed 2015 2016
- 50 partners committed to delivering 100 actions

Examples of local planning and action: Edinburgh Adapts



Vision and action plan developed over 6 month period through workshops and one to one consultation.

New leadership and governance arrangements set up.

Momentum building and implementation underway:

- Embedding adaptation across policy areas
- Pooling expertise
- Quick wins





Re-imagining streets project - Granton



The design of streets and gardens can significantly influence an areas resilience to climate impacts.

Large amounts of paved areas contribute to surface water flooding, reduced biodiversity and urban heat island effect.







Re-imagining streets project - Granton



The Re-imagining streets project has included a series of public engagement events in Granton, Edinburgh. Through the project community members took part in creative process to re-imagine their neighbourhoods for climate change adaptation.
